

SECURITY

Pursuant to Article 11(9) of the Private Security Act (Official Gazette of the Republic of Slovenia No. 17/2011), the Concession Agreement on Port Activities, Management, Development and Regular Maintenance of the Port Infrastructure in the Freight Port of Koper Area as of 8 September 2008, the Port Regulations of 17 March 2020, the company <u>LUKA KOPER, d.d., Vojkovo nabrežje 38, 6501 Koper</u>, with regard to port's protected area, hereby publishes the following

SPECIAL RULES FOR ENSURING ORDER

- In the protected area/zone of the Port of Koper (hereinafter: the protected area), which
 is managed by LUKA KOPER, d.d., all persons are obliged to comply with these Special
 Rules for Ensuring Order and Port Regulations of LUKA KOPER, d.d.
- 2. In the protected area, all persons are obliged to respect the instructions of the security staff of LUKA KOPER, d.d. when they are carrying out tasks of protection of people and property. Pursuant to the Private Security Act, LUKA KOPER, d.d. security staff and their contractual partners may, when carrying out tasks of protection of people and property, use the measures and comply with the duties laid down in the Private Security Act.
- 3. Persons who do not fulfil the conditions for entry to the protected area of LUKA KOPER, d.d. are not allowed to enter the protected area.
- 4. Before entering the protected area, everyone is obliged to obtain a valid permit (access pass) and to display it in the manner provided for in the Port Regulations of LUKA KOPER, d.d. The external contractors are obliged to obtain a valid access pass and a valid identity document, and they are obliged to wear the access pass in a visible place at all times during their stay.
- 5. Persons who have been denied access to the port already after entering the port's protected area, or persons unjustifiably staying in the protected area must immediately leave the protected area of LUKA KOPER, d.d.
- 6. Persons who violate the provisions of these Special Rules for Ensuring Order and the Port Regulations of LUKA KOPER, d.d. are also obliged to leave the protected area of LUKA KOPER, d.d.
- 7. The security guard may take the following measures against all persons who are in the protected area of LUKA KOPER, d.d.: issue of a warning, giving oral order(s), requesting personal identification, performing superficial inspection of person's clothing, inspection of the interior of the vehicle, cargo and luggage of the person, preventing entry into the protected area, detention of a person, use of physical force, and use of handcuffs and tying expedients. Security guards may also use other expedients against offenders, namely gas spray and firearms. All of the above shall be carried out in accordance with the Private Security Act.
- 8. Alcoholic beverages, drugs, electronic and technical devices, weapons and other dangerous objects that could endanger the safety of people and property must not be introduced into the protected area of LUKA KOPER, d.d.
- 9. Following person's entry to the protected area, the security guard may request from any person whom he/she suspects does not meet the conditions for entry as set out in the Port Regulations of LUKA KOPER, d.d., to present a valid identity document in order to establish the identity of that person. A security guard can check the identity of any person present in the protected area whenever he/she considers that the person does not meet the conditions for entry to the protected area laid down in the Port Regulations of LUKA KOPER, d.d.
- 10. The access to the protected area is allowed only to the prescribed number of visitors. Once the maximum permissible number of visitors is reached, the security guard may prevent other persons from entering the port area.
